
## **ALUMNI**


The following feedback was received from the alumni of our college for the session 2020-21:





The alumni of the college have rated the content of the syllabi between good and excellent (nearing 85 percent).

Over 50 percent of the respondents either agree or strongly agree that the programme outcomes are well defined.










Around 48 percent respondents agree and strongly agree that the curriculum is balanced with respect to theory and practical. Where, 20 percent of respondents held a neutral stand.


Over 40 percent of respondents agree and strongly agree that curriculum is up to their expectations. But a good number holds a neutral stand on this issue (29.19 percent).







Around 89 percent respondents stated that they were given assignments as students.

On an average around 77.75 percent syllabus was covered in class.












Nearly, three fourth of our respondents, our alumni have graded their overall learning experience in the college as either good or excellent.











A little over 80 percent of our alumni have rated the college as good or excellent. Majority of the respondents stated that they would recommend the college to others seeking admission.

## **FACULTY**


The current report reflects the feedback so received from the faculty members of the college.





It was found that over 50 percent of the faculty members are engaged in teaching under graduate classes alone. And around 44 percent in teaching both under graduate and post graduate classes. This can be majorly attributed the fact that the under graduate courses run by the college outnumber the post graduate courses.

It was found that around 12 percent of our faculty members are a member of board of studies.

Around 70 percent respondents have responded in affirmative (agree and strongly agree) that the syllabus is need based. Whereas one fifth of the respondent held a neutral stand.










Majority of the faculty members agree that the programme outcome of the course are well specified.

Similarly over 50 percent of the faculty members found the curriculum balanced from both theoretical and practical perspective,










Nearing 70% of faculty members prefer blended mode of teaching followed by offline teaching (a little over 22 percent) and then online teaching (below 10 percent).


Over 85 percent teachers attended FDPs to enrich their skills and help build capacity.

A little over 80 percent of the faculty members either agree or strongly agree that the library is well equipped and accessible.










Around 85 percent of faculty members either agree or strongly agree to computer facilities being made available by the college in order to facilitate ICT based teaching.

Various teaching modes are used by our faculty members, like lecturing, GDs, PPTs case studies, videos and animations etc.


## **STUDENT**





Majority of the respondents chose the course out of personal interest (67.48 percent) followed by those who had specific degree requirements.

Over 65 percent of respondents are satisfied with mode being used for teaching.










Over three third of the respondents stated that the level of efforts invested by the teachers in online teaching is either good or very good.

Similarly over 60 percent of the respondents have graded the course material provided by the teachers as either good or very good.










Over 70 percent of the students prefer offline mode of teaching visa-vis online mode of teaching.

The students have also asserted that the institution took all necessary steps to keep them well informed.










Majority of the students (nearing 90 percent) replied in affirmation that the institution took all necessary steps to check the spread of COVID19.

Over 50 percent of the students were aware about the College COVID counselling cell.









Over 50 percent of the students rated the effectiveness of working of COVID Counselling cell as either good over very good.
