Academic Collaboration

The college participated in the **15th Chandigarh Science Congress (CHASCON 2022)** organized by Panjab University, Chandigarh on 15 September.









The **Department of Zoology** displayed human evolutionary models, aquatic ecosystems, demonstrated bee hive and honey bee products, life cycle of parasites through 2D models and presented highlights of departmental research. Various job-oriented prospects and applications of Zoology were also displayed and discussed.

The **Department of Chemistry** represented the college by presenting posters on the research work carried out at the department.

The **Department of Physics** presented working models describing 'Seven Segment Display' and 'Anti Sleep Alarm' and a detailed overview of the departmental research activities was given.

The **Department of Botany** exhibited **'Sustainable Green Practices'** at CHASCON 22. The students spread awareness on biocomposting, hydroponics and growing indoor plants in terrariums made out of waste containers as a part of waste management practices. A prototype of bioinsecticide prepared by the students of the department was the center of attraction.

Students got an opportunity to interact with the several researchers, including environmental activist, **Mr. Amandeep Singh** who is working on the mission of water conservation in the state of Punjab and expressed his desire to collaborate with the college on issues related to environment sensitization.

Highlighting the key aspects of IPR and the processes involved in patent filing, Sh. 

The students were accompanied by **Dr. Gurjeet Kaur**.










Holistic Development of Learners






An awareness session on 'Innovation and Entrepreneurship Policy' was organised by IIC on 21 October.
