
## **India Today Ranking**






## **Induction Ceremony**

#### **Cyber Security Conclave: Securing The Digital India**




Postgraduate Department of Fashion Designing organized an interactive session with an alumnus of 2015-2018 batch Mr. Sachin Choyal on 21 September.

### **Health and Wellness**


#### Anemia Awareness Session under Poshan Abhiyaan: Promoting Health and Well-being

Project Ambika, an Initiative by Enactus, organized its first sanitary napkins distribution drive on 25 Septemberataslum area near Elante.









In the mid of camp a rank ceremony was also held by the batallion in which the following five cadets were appointed:






