
Prem Bhatia Lecture Series with Ms Manraj Grewal Sharma

They were also tasked with creating one project and two assignments each, aligning with learning outcomes, benchmarking, and CO PO mapping. October 30 served as a teamwork day for online collaboration.

Day 7 - Presentation and Submission:

On 31 October, throughout the session, groups presented their final presentations, showcasing the comprehensive exploration of Outcome-Based Education with a focus on subject-specific benchmarking of learning outcomes. November 1 marked the online submission of individual projects assigned on October 28, concluding the week-long FDP.

In a significant stride towards fostering innovation and entrepreneurship, Punjab Innovation Mission and college officially entered into a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU).










Mental Health Week Celebrations




